Where "positive law" is discussed, the emphasis is on the legal questions that must be addressed by a field of law and on the different kinds of solutions that have been adopted by—for instance—the common law and the civil law tradition.

The book covers a wide range of legal issues in Indonesia, including court system and judicial decision making, criminal law, private law, constitutional law and constitutional arrangement of state, land law; administrative law; Islamic law; corruption; judicial reform; environmental law; human rights and the relationship between international law and Indonesian Law.

The legitimacy and recognition of Crimea: A conundrum

The Crimean Peninsula was an autonomous territory of the Crimean Soviet Socialist Republic in October 1921, as part of the Union of the Russian Soviet Federative Socialist Republics. By a unilateral decision from the highest Soviet Presidium in 1924, Nikita Khrushchev, the Soviet leader at the time, transferred the Peninsula to the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic. Such issue hardly mattered until the Soviet Union broke up in 1991. Following the referendum held by Ukraine at the end of 2014, Crimea agreed to remain part of Ukraine, but with significant autonomy, including its own constitution and legislation.

Due to financial problems faced by Ukraine in 2013, the State tried to work out a deal with the International Monetary Fund (IMF), but Russia offered a \$10 billion bailout instead. The majority of people in Ukraine decided to work with the European Union (EU). The Ukrainian Government, however, opposed working out the trade deal with the EU and took side with Russia instead on the grounds Ukraine did not have its own independent source of oil and had been dependent on Russia to provide it. Such decision then was perceived as a violation of the principles of peace and stability and even escalated the urgency of the crisis. According to the Government negotiated with the protesters:

In addition to the use of force authorized by the UN Security Council, Article 51 of the UN Charter permits the use of armed force in the form of self-defense against armed attacks from other States. This is also known as the principle of "legitimate self-defense". Self-defense against the armed attack that was conducted by Russia. In fact, Ukraine had asked for the help from North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) to look at all possible means to help in protecting Ukraine's territorial integrity, sovereignty, people, and nuclear facilities within Ukraine's territory. Even so, Ukraine is only allowed to use armed force to defend itself and the Security Council takes the necessary action to preserve and maintain international peace and security. ■






KERJASAMA YANG MENGHASILKAN SCOPUS BERDASARKAN PRODI 2019/2020


